DEFINING THE ROLE OF THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES

The chief responsibilities of the Board of Trustees at an independent school are:

- 1. To establish, review, update, and safeguard the mission of the school
- 2. To hire, support, evaluate, and, if necessary, to terminate the contract of the Head of School
- 3. To ensure the acquisition and stewardship of financial resources and facilities to enable the school to pursue its mission effectively
- 4. To plan strategically for the future of the school.

To fulfill these responsibilities, the Board of Trustees:

- 1. Assumes a role of setting major policies, delegating the management of operations to the Head (who shares some of this responsibility with the faculty and staff)
- 2. Establishes a collaborative relationship with the Head and confers with him/her to ensure soundness as it sets major policies
- 3. Systematically recruits, selects, and orients new members to bolster its ongoing effectiveness
- 4. Organizes itself, usually through a committee or task force system, to accomplish its work
- 5. Communicates with the school's constituencies regarding the Board's major activities and decisions
- 6. Takes responsibility for educating itself through reading, discussion, participation in the life of the school, and involvement in professional growth opportunities
- 7. Evaluates its performance so that it can appreciate its successes and improve its competence.
